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TOWN OF CROMWELL COVID-19 ADVISORY FACILITY USE REVISED 5/3/21

The Town of Cromwell, effective June 1, 2021 has revised their plan for in person programs/activities inside Town Hall. Departments Included in these programs /activities are Recreation, Library, Human Services, Senior Center and Youth Services. After reviewing the guidelines set forth by the State of Connecticut in consultation with our town staff and local Health Official we are confident we have exercised proper due-diligence to protect individuals with the following proposed guidelines:

GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR ALL CROMWELL INDOOR PROGRAMS/ACTIVITIES

- Any individual participating in our in-person programs should not attend if he/she is exhibiting symptoms or illness consistent with COVID-19 ([About COVID-19 | CDC](#)).
- All individuals should practice social distance guidelines of 6 ft. or greater at all times if unvaccinated. Masks should be worn at all time indoors.
- People of any age who have serious underlying medical conditions or are at higher risk for severe illness from COVID-19 are recommended to stay at home. A list of medical conditions associated with a higher risk for severe illness from COVID-19 can be found in [About COVID-19 | CDC](#).¹ Individuals and families should consult their healthcare provider to determine whether they have medical conditions that place them at risk.

PROTOCOLS

- Facility preparations/modifications:
 - Restroom facilities cleaned and sanitized daily by Town Staff
 - Shared balls/equipment will be disinfected before and after every program or activity. The user group is responsible for this action.
- Hand sanitizer (provided by the user/organization). Town Hall has many canisters available throughout the building, you are welcome to utilize them.
- Impact to socially distancing during programs/activities:
 - Participants keep appropriately distanced from others at all times.
 - No social gathering before or after programs/activities.
 - Parents should drop-off, remain in vehicles and/or follow social distancing guidelines. No gatherings in parking lots, outside classrooms or inside main lobby.

At this time, only Town Programs/Activities will be allowed. No outside groups will be allowed to use or rent Town Space. This will be re-evaluated as we receive additional information from state DPH/local/CDC agencies, at which time our strategies will be adjusted accordingly.

We understand that we need to be fluid and prepared to adapt and communicate changes as we move forward in these sensitive times. Town officials will monitor these programs/activities to ensure our guidelines are being followed. Town officials reserve the right to issue an immediate verbal cease and desist if any program/activity or person is found violating the state/local/CDC guidelines. **Our guidelines will remain in effect until state/local/CDC guidelines change.** Upon the acceptance of these guidelines, we require each group to disseminate these policies to your instructors, participants, and patrons that participate and/or compete.

¹Includes chronic lung disease or moderate to severe asthma, serious heart conditions, immunocompromised (cancer treatment, smoking, bone marrow or organ transplantation, immune deficiencies, poorly controlled HIV or AIDS, and prolonged use of corticosteroids and other immune weakening medications), severe obesity (body mass index [BMI] of 40 or higher), diabetes, chronic kidney disease undergoing dialysis and liver disease.
